## Senior Night/Homecoming

On this very special Friday night we honor our 13 seniors, who will play their final games in Marco Stadium. They are: Antoine White (1), Alex Owen (4), Greg Kingscott (6), Coner Doherty (8), Manoj Bhutani (11), Scott Bozworth (42), Jamie Werner (51), Artie Cifarelli (57), Jeff Mansbach (65), Pat Haar (66), Michael Siegrist (68), Charles

Mouton (75), and Colton Keune (81).

Whitman's Varsity (3-5) hosts the Churchill Bulldogs, also 3-5, in their final home game of the season, which is also Homecoming for the Vikings. Churchill, also in the 4A West Division, has had a number of common opponents with the Vikings. Among that group, the Bulldogs have beaten Wootton

(28-14), while losing to Northwest (29-7), Gaithersburg (35-3), Springbrook (9-7), and Magruder (34-10).

The previous two weeks the Vikings, and their loyal fans, have experienced the highest of highs and the lowest of lows. Two weeks ago, in a thrilling performance before a raucous home crowd, Whitman came back to defeat Springbrook 28-19. Springbrook, which entered the game with a 5-1 record, stormed to a 10-0 lead in the second quarter

before Whitman answered. After Springbrook's talented back Adou Kouadio scored from one yard out to make it 10-0, Whitman began its comeback with quarterback Greg Kingscott completing a 50 yard pass to Alex Owen, followed by an 18 yard pass to receiver Antoine White for the TD. An Aaron Norris (9) extra point, off a Jeff Susskind (7) hold and a Mike Siegrist snap, made the score 10-7 and a subsequent 32 yard field goal for Springbrook made the halftime score 13-7.

## JV Vikes Nipped by Barons

The Viking JV home game against the Bethesda-Chevy Chase Barons started with much anticipation. The junior Vikes seemed well-positioned for a win, having defeated the Northwest HS JV team the previous week in a hard-fought, exciting, come-from-behind win on Northwest's home turf. And the Viking varsity had crushed the Baron varsity days before in front of a large home crowd.

Matching that anticipation, the JV scored on their first drive. Sophomore Corey Freeman (3) took the kick-off and ran for ten yards, giving the Vikings decent field position. Right away, freshman QB Larry Kline (10) took the snap and ran the ball to midfield for a first down. Then freshman running back Kevin Cecala (25) advanced the ball another nine yards, followed by freshman running back Danny Lee (31) for another 15 yards. After losing five yards on a false start

call, and another 15 yards on a holding call, Kline completed a pass to sophomore wide receiver Mark Jutkowitz (5) for 20 yards, gaining it all back. The steady, solid work of the offensive line kept the JV pounding closer and closer to the goal. With 6:08 left in the first quarter of play, Kline handed off to Cecala for nine yards, enough for a Whitman touchdown. Lee delivered a perfectly-kicked extra point, and quickly the Vikings were up 7-0.

The Baron's first drive demonstrated the superb defensive work of the Vikings. Sophomore defensive lineman Deven Nettles (53) effectively stopped the drive on second down when he stuffed the Baron QB deep in the backfield. They couldn't recover from Nettles' handiwork, and they had to punt on fourth down.

The Vikings started another drive at midfield, but this time the possession went nowhere. After a

Vikings three and out, the Barons took the ball and bucked up against a strong Whitman D-line. On second down, freshman linebacker Jojo Dobbs (82) blasted into the backfield and sacked the quarterback as he let loose a pass, which went incomplete. The defense held their ground, and BCC had to kick. The next possessions by each team resulted in nothing for either side. Defensively, though, several Vikes had stand-out performances. Lee spent his time manhandling the opponent, usually for a loss and usually to stop the drive, and during the Barons' final drive of the half sophomore defensive lineman Lubo Mitov (56) delivered a punishing sack to the QB which stalled the drive. In that same series, on fourth and eight, freshman linebacker Nejad Sassan (32) gave magnificent pursuit and tackled the ball carrier to stop the Barons on fourth down.

On the first Baron possession of the second half, freshman defensive back Carson Kline (15) jumped high in the air to break up

a pass play that would surely have resulted in big yardage, for which he received a much-noticed high five by his brother Larry. Despite his efforts, the drive represented the first time in the game that the Barons moved the ball successfully against the Viking defense. They gained huge yardage with a running game, a passing game and a couple of reverses. They pushed their way right to the Whitman one-yard line, where they fumbled the ball. Whitman recovered and on the very first play after the fumble recovery, Kline ran for 29 yards, but was downed by an audible helmet to helmet tackle. Though another 15 yards was tacked on to the end of the run, no one was celebrating because Kline was slow to get up, exiting to the cheers of his teammates and the spectators. But the Vikings were penalized one play later, 10 yards for a block in the back, and another 15 yards for a personal foul, all in the same play. Unable to overcome this deficit, they punted.

## JV Vikes Beat Magruder 13-6

The Whitman JV Vikings faced off against the Colonels of Magruder High School at the Magruder home field on a cold Thursday evening, Oct. 26. The Vikes were supported by a small, loyal, but very noisy group of fans. Though the night was cold, the Vikes would not let this, nor the sheer size of the opponent's defensive line, deter them. This would prove to be a game where big momentum-changing plays did not occur: instead, the Vikings made solid plays over and over again throughout the game, which had the effect of turning the tide and created the winning momentum for the Vikings.

The Vikes won the toss and opted to wait to receive the ball until the second half. Freshman Danny Lee (31) kicked off, a nice long and high kick, which was promptly returned for a touchdown by Magruder sophomore running back Pablo Flores, who was thought by many on the Viking team to be Marguder's key player. He took the ball and ran it back for

90 yards, slipping through every Whitman player in his way. But the kick for the extra point was no good, and within a minute, the score was Magruder 6, Whitman 0.

Whitman took their first possession and freshman QB Larry Kline (10) ran all three plays, but the Vikes failed to get first down yardage. They punted, and the Colonels were able to see right away the sheer tenacity of the Viking defense. The Vikes were able to create havoc in the Marguder offensive line, with freshman linebacker Jojo Dobbs (82) causing a fumble, and a major sack by sophomore Deven Nettles (53) on a 3rd and 18 that forced a punt. The reality of the Whitman defensive line was beginning to be understood by Magruder.

On Whitman's next drive, freshman defensive back Patrick Slawta (20) pounced on a fumble to save the drive from being turned over, but the drive stalled anyway, forcing a punt. When the Colonels took over again, they were pounded by sophomore lineman

Anthony Vekstein (68), who had a sack so huge that together with a holding call against the Colonels, the second down play was 41 yards shy of the 1st down marker. The Vikes didn't let anything pass, and on 4th and 41 Magruder punted. Freshman special teams player Carson Kline (15), whose play in this game was indispensable to the win, ran it back for 15 yards before being brought down. The Vikings took over with a 1st and 5 after an

offside call against Magruder. On this series, QB Kline, freshman defensive back Danny Lee (31) and freshman running back Kevin Cecala combined running and passing plays to push the ball to the goal line. On 2nd and goal, Kline faked a hand-off to Cecala but passed to Lee, who pushed it through for the score. The extra point was unsuccessful, and the game was tied at 6-6.

As the game wore on, the Viking defense steadily improved against Kouadio, who had come into the game with 780 yards rushing and nine touchdowns. The Vikings were determined not to lose this game. They scored three touchdowns in the second half to just one for Springbrook. Two Kingscott TD runs of one and 21 yards were sandwiched around an 18 yard touchdown pass from Kingscott to Mike Lee (88). All in all, it was the best performance by the Vikings this year against a very solid opponent, and a very exciting game to watch for the jubilant home crowd.

Last week's game, however, represented the lowest of the lows as the Vikings fell to the Magruder Colonels by 14-12. It was a game that seemed quite winnable but the elements, the referees, and just plain bad luck seemed to conspire against the Vikings that night. A cold and rainy night made it almost impossible for the Vikings to throw the ball, not to mention miserable for the hardy and loud

As if fueled by the sting of the fumble on the one, the Barons marched down the length of the field and the Vikings seemed powerless to stop them. Every play yielded huge gains, and twice during the drive the Whitman defense helped them out with penalties that resulted in automatic first downs. Finally, the Barons scored, and then successfully completed a two-point conversion on a quick pass that gave them the lead, 8-7, late in the fourth quarter.

Although the Vikes JV had the last possession, they could not score, and the clock ran out with this disappointing outcome. The stunned JV Vikings must have felt like Northwest had felt the previous week: incredulous that a team they thought they could defeat handily would instead come up with the win.

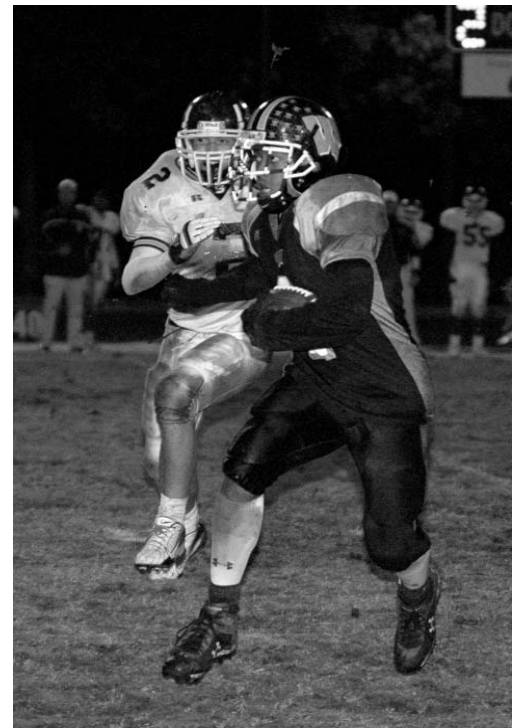
band of supporters on the visitors' sidelines. The key play of the game was a two-point conversion that Whitman attempted which would have tied the game at 14 in the second half. Kingscott handed off to White up the middle, who appeared to easily break the plane, but the officials ruled that he did not. After the game, numerous players, including White, said that he had gotten into the end zone. Unfortunately, that loss effectively ended any playoff hopes that Whitman had for this season.

Churchill is led by their quarterback Curran Chabra who threw for 220 yards and a touchdown in their loss to Magruder. His primary target was receiver Connor Phillips who hauled in seven passes for 94 yards in that game. If the Vikings can knock off the Bulldogs and finish with a win against Walter Johnson in the season finale, they would have a 5-5 record. Given all that has been stacked against them this season, that would be no small accomplishment.

This Viking team played what is probably the toughest schedule in the entire State of Maryland in the

first half of the season. They also had to deal with all the effects from the “Smoothie King” episode involving some of their former teammates, not the least of which was the loss of three talented starters. Led by a very talented, resourceful and hard working senior class, they have persevered and are looking to “finish with honor”.

We honor all the Vikings tonight, and particularly those seniors who have so distinguished themselves in this program for the last four seasons. For most of them, this will be their last season of football. They will remember these games and their teammates for the rest of their lives. We will

The next several series were characterized by great plays by the Whitman defense. Sophomore defensive back Mark Jutkowitz (5) knocked away a pass in the end zone which would have been a TD for Magruder. Nettles had another sack, and sophomore defensive lineman Roy Briggs (55) relentlessly pounded the Magruder offensive line. The Colonels arrived at the goal line anyway, but were stymied on every effort, and finally attempted a field goal kick. But Dobbs and Kline blasted through the line and caused a fumble, and the Vikings took over.

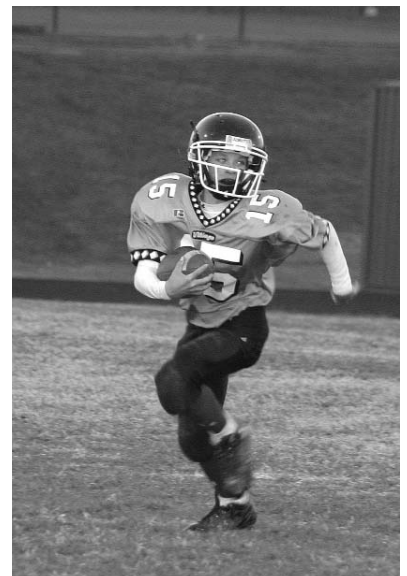
The Colonels, seeing that the Viking defense could penetrate their offensive line, started a passing game that was stymied by Carson Kline. Kline knocked away half a dozen passes for incompletions, including one in the end zone on a fourth and 13 that would have changed the outcome of the game.

After the half, the Vikings received the ball, and with possession and confidence the Vikings again drove to the Colonel goal. On this drive Lee and Kline took turns pushing the defense back, aided by freshman tight end Danny Shannahan (13), who created extra running space for Kline with a superb open field tackle. On 1st and goal, Kline ran it around the side in a quarterback keeper to push the Vikings ahead 13-6, with Lee's good extra point.

Now it was the Colonels turn to try and tie the score. With the clock running down, the Colonels couldn't convert on third and 15, and the fourth down play was not enough for a 1st down. The Vikings took over on their own 35, but a first down fumble gave the Colonels the ball again, close to the Viking goal, and a fresh set of downs. Each successful Magruder play was followed by a play in which the Viking defense pushed the offensive line back for a loss, or struck

down a pass. Finally it was fourth down, and the Colonels final attempt was shut down and the ball turned over to the Vikes on downs. Kline took a knee and the game was over. The sweet victory was hard and honestly won, and showed off the extreme talent on the Viking squad.

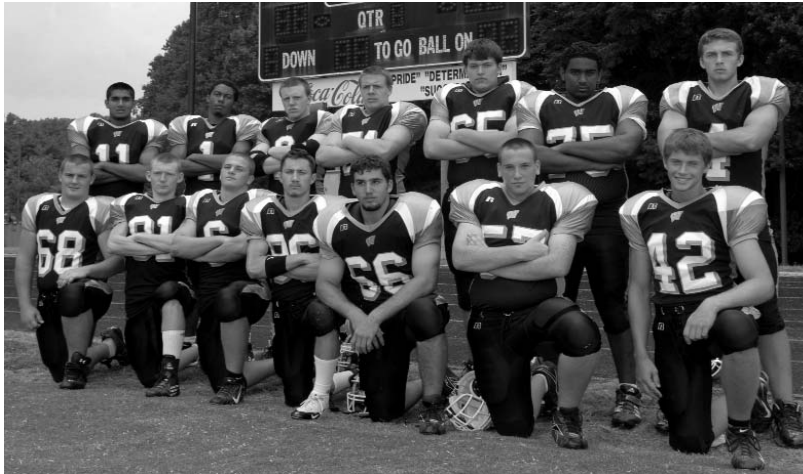

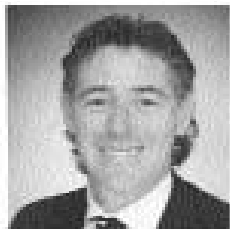
